Nathan Crosby, his descendents and the Baptist Churches of Barrington (1)

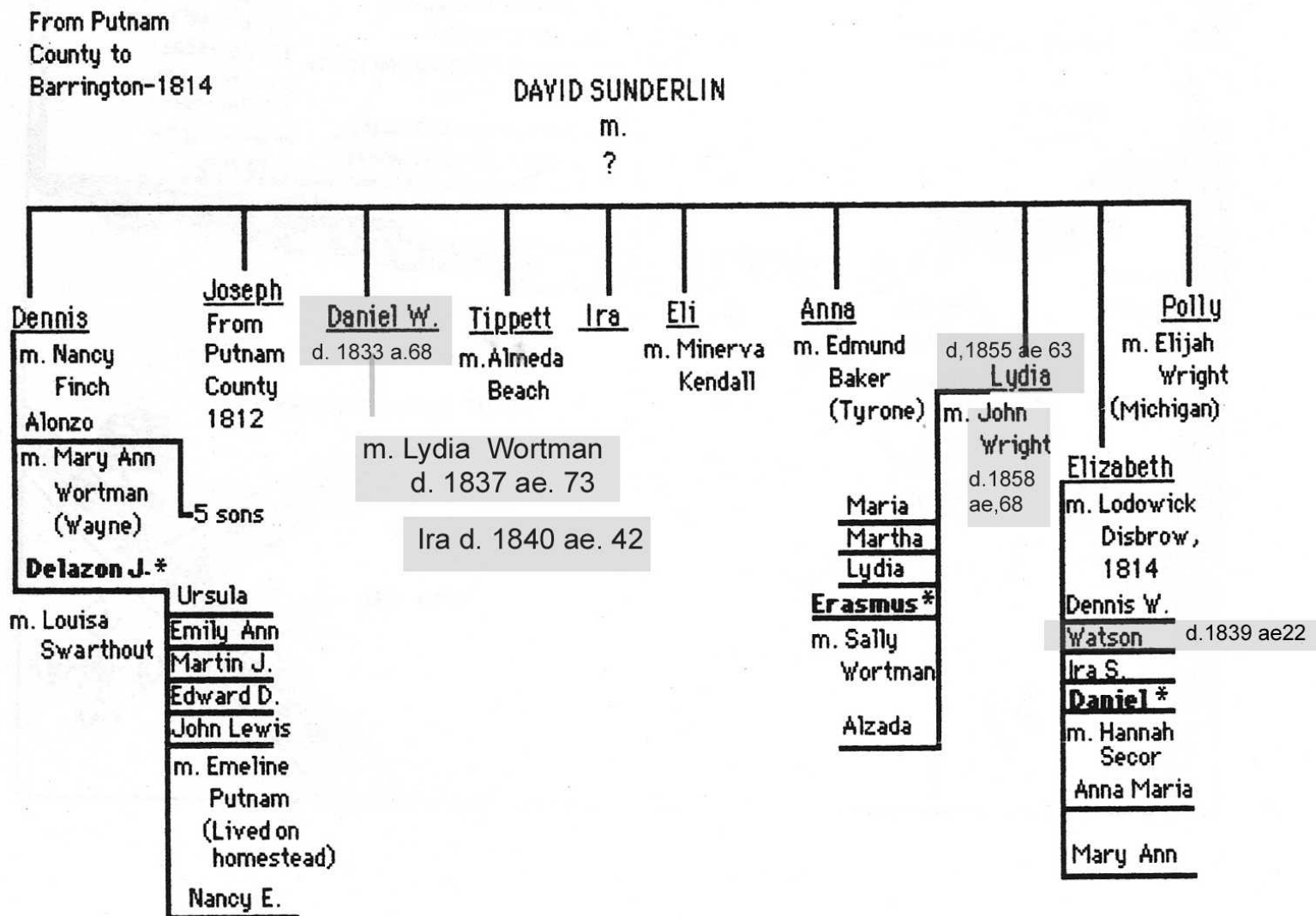
- **Nathan Crosby and wife Lydia Cole came to Sunderlin Hollow** from Putnam County in 1812. Both were **42 years of age**.
- 2. They were **cousins** and were **both Mayflower descendents**, he of Stephen Hopkins and she of both Stephen Hopkins and William Brewster
- 3. With them were sons **Selah**, age, and **Peter S.**, age 9, and Cyus, and daughters Miriam, Sarah, Ether, Abigail,
- 4. After 2 years they went back to Delaware county, returning in 1815 to Milo and finally settling on the future **Roger Allen farm on Welker Rd.in 1818.**
- 5. Nathan.s oldest son **Selah was one of the first to be baptised** in the new Baptist Church in 1819.
- 6. Selah was also a **school teacher** in Sunderlin Hollow (1815-816), and married **Fanny Wortman**, oldest child of pioneer **William Wortman**
- 7. Selah purchased **property from Ephriam Wright** and lived near the Wortman clan on Van Gordon Rd. in 1876 (see Atlas)
- 7. Nathan **died at 55 in 1825** apparently while living on Welker Rd. He was one of the **first to be buried at the Cemetery**. Unlike the Fintons, his neighbors, he did not establish a family cemetery.

8. While living on Welker Rd., Nathan and family wemy nu carroage tp church in Sunderlin Hollow, bi'passing the closer Methodist house fellowship under William Overnshire's leadership at the closer Porter's Corner and the Free Will Baptist Church near the former Teeple's Tavern
9. Nathan's son Peter S. Crosby would become one of the **founders of the Warsaw Baptist church** in.1838
10. His grandsons Joseph and Isaac were among the founders of the village of Cosby on Keuka lake and among the founders of the **Crosby Baptist Church** in 1888

The Descendents of William Wortman and the Sunderlin Hollow “Clan”

William Wortman b. 1779 m. **Anna Swarthout** 1781 in Hector dau of Anthony Swarthout and Elizabeth Lockwood

Born 30-Mar-1779 in Near New Brunswick, New Jersey, died 16-Nov-1850 in Barrington, Yates County, New York, buried in Wayne Baptist Cemetery, Tyrone, Schuyler Co., New York.

He married Anna Swarthout here in Peach Orchard, on the shores of Lake Seneca

About 1813 the family moved to Crystal Springs in what was to become Barrington, Yates County, New York. This area was originally settled by people from Putnam county the year before. **He cleared land bounded by the Bath road and the county line.** It is uncertain why he moved to the new land farther west, perhaps the growing family needed more land to survive. The land may have just been better here. William went to the area first and then after an area was cleared and a cabin put up, the rest of the family came. By 1821 the area was populated enough to have a Baptist meeting house built.

1. **Fanny Wortman** born 25-Jun-1801. M. **Selah Fay Crosby**, married 1820 in Barrington (1 yr. after Selah's baptism in the new church)
 - **Amos Wortman** born 01-Sep-1803. He married (1) **Catharine Herrick**, born 28-Mar-1807. born 4.
 - **Charlotte Wortman** born ___-___-1807. **Ogden Sherwood**, born 1805 in Vermont, died by 1860
4. **Mary Ann Wortman** born 6-Dec-1807. **Alonzo W. Sunderlin**, married ___-Oct-1825, born ___-___-1806 in NY, (son of **Dennis Sunderlin** and **Nancy Finch**)
5. **Asa Wortman** born 16-Feb-1810. He married **Harriet Angeline Boyce**, born 07-May 1812 in NY, (daughter of **John Boyce** and **Beulah Tuttle**) died 25-Aug-1901 in Barrington, Yates County, NY
Children:
 - **Lydia Ann Wortman**, born 15-Feb-1833, died 05-May-1841, buried in Barrington Baptist Cemetery, Barrington, Yates Co., NY. (only w\Wortman buried in cem.)
6. **Joel Wortman** born 13-Mar-1812. He married (1) **Martha Patti Ann Bailey**, married 07-Feb-1838, born 01-Aug-1819 in Barrington, Yates County, NY, (daughter of **Joseph Bailey** and **Dezira Wright**) died 12-Feb-1848, buried in Lakeview Cemetery Penn Yan, New York.
7. **Lavina Wortman** born 1814. She married **Charles Swarthout**, born 1822 in Yates County, New York, (son of **James A. Swarthout** and **Betsey Ketchum**) died after 1880 in Michigan.
8. **Halsey Wortman** born 19-May-1816. He married **Hulda Robinson**, born 7-Nov-1820 in Putnam County, New York, (daughter of **Carle Robinson** and **Rachel Winters**) died 27-Apr-1887 in Elgin, Kane County, Illinois,

James W. Swarthout

At the first Town meeting of 1823, James Swarthout, with Lodowick Disbrow, were elected commissioners of Highway. He was Supervisor in 1830 and 1831. He died in 1851. His wife Betsy died 1832; Erasmus died 1873 and Lyman died 1865.

Cemetery Property History

The cemetery property was apparently part of **John Wright's** 500 acres. It was probably left to his son **Ephraim** following John Wright's death in 1858. It was purchased by Crystal Springs Entrepreneur (and former Erasmus Wright partner) **Benson Smith** at sheriff's sale in 1883. From Smith the property transferred to **Ira Rapalee**, then to the **Hamners** of Dundee, then to the **Kauffmans** in 1951.

Deed research has thus far revealed no mention of the cemetery.
